

IS IT A Cold OR THE Flu?

SYMPTOMS	COLD	NFLU
FEVER	Rare	Usual; high (100°F to 102°F, occasionally higher, especially in young children); lasts 3 to 4 days
HEADACHE	Rare	Common
GENERAL/ACHES PAINS	Slight	Usual; often severe
FATIGUE, WEAKNESS	Sometimes	Usual; can last up to 2 to 3 weeks
EXTREMELEXHAUSTION	Never	Usual; at the beginning of the illness
STUFFY NOSE	Common	Sometimes
SNEEZING	Usual	Sometimes
SORE THROAT	Common	Sometimes
CHEST DISCOMPORT, COUCH	Mild to moderate; hacking cough	Common; can become severe
TREATMENT	 Antihistamines Decongestants Nonsteroidal anti-inflammatory medicines 	 Antiviral medicines—see your healthcare provider
PREVENTION	 Wash your hands often with soap and water Avoid close contact with anyone who has a cold 	 Annual vaccination Antiviral medicines—see your healthcare provider
COMPLICATIONS	Sinus infection	Bronchitis, pneumonia
	Middle ear infection	Can worsen chronic conditions
	■ Asthma	Can be life-threatening. Complications more likely in the elderly, those with chronic conditions, young children, and pregnant women.
